Year Books (Breed Books)

Background:

For almost 50 years the BTCA has printed Year Books of all AKC or AWTA titled dogs. These books are important documented pieces of the Club's history. Prior to 1988, these publications were referred to as "Breed Books"

They provide a multi-generation record of the breed's roots and versatility, with many dogs titled in multiple disciplines.

Currently, the update and printing of the books is handled by the Year Book Committee (see Procedure 1-03)

Format (commencing with 1999 Year Book):

Starting with the 1999 Year Book, there will be one photo* page of each dog receiving a title in each year.

This page will include a pedigree, color, breeder, owner, birth date, health clearances and all the information for the titles earned that year (including majors, qualifying scores etc.) and any other pertinent information.

If necessary, more than one page will be allocated for the yearly accomplishments, however the information will all be together with the photo.

All dogs will be listed alphabetically regardless of titles earned.

The titles will be indexed by category.

** To encourage owners to supply a photograph for the dogs being featured in the Year Book, there is currently no charge for the submission of a photograph.*

Printing:

No more than 100 copies of new Breed Books will be printed unless pre-orders exceed that quantity.

Storage and Distribution:

Year Books/Breed Books past and present are currently stored at various locations throughout the country.

They are ordered through the Border Store.

The individual handling the Border Store is responsible for knowing the location of the various issues and notifies the respective depository to mail out the books.
